

# QUARTER LOG CABIN

RAINBOW SCRAP CHALLENGE 2014 SCRAPHAPPY SAMPLER



There are so many variations on the Log Cabin quilt block. This one is a quarter log. You could make a block of course, and cut it into four sections, but when you only need one, this is the way to go.

## FABRIC

You will need 1.5-inch strips of fabric for this block. I used 5 different blues,

## CUTTING

Start with a 1.5-inch square for the first round.

Round 2 needs a 1.5-inch square and a rectangle 1.5 by 2.5

Round 3 needs a rectangle 1.5 by 2.5 inches and one that is 1.5 by 3.5

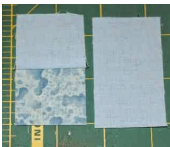
Round 4 needs a rectangle that is 1.5 by 3.5 inches and one that is 1.5 by 4.5

Round 5 needs a rectangle that is 1.5 by 4.5 inches and one that is 1.5 by 5.5 inches

Round 6 needs a rectangle that is 1.5 by 5.5 inches and one that is 1.5 by 6.5 inches

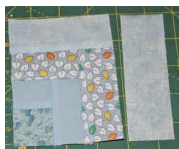


## SEWING



Start with the two 1.5 inch squares. Press away from the corner square and then add the 2.5 inch long piece.

You will continue working in rounds by adding the short piece to the side with a seam and the long piece to the adjacent side.



Keep going until all the pieces are sewn together



## FINISHING

Your block should be 6.5 inches unfinished. It will finish at 6 inches in the final quilt. I alternated solids and prints for each round and tried to go from light to dark. Go crazy and have fun with your scraps!
